Grand Falls on Mississippi - Yes, this is the Mississippi River, but it's not the one you might be thinking of. Ontario has its own unique Mississippi River. There are two waterfalls, one with a hydro dam that can vibrate the ground if the water flows strong enough. The more significant falls are truly imposing after the spring melt, and they continue to flow well all year long.

Blakeney Rapids - Just up the road. A series of smaller falls where kayaking competitions are held. There are several trails that take you along the river. Stay close to the river to watch how the water tumbles. Return to the car when you reach the end of the rapids. WARNING: There is a portal to another dimension at the parking lot. It looks like a door that leads to nowhere. Do not enter it. Anyone who walks through it might disappear to another realm. Or not. I really do not know, but don't go there, just to be safe.

Canadian War Museum

After this museum, walk across the street to see:

- Canadian Firefighter Museum
- Walk along the pathway to the viewing area of Chaudiere Falls

Supper - Figure out what you want to eat.

Consider **Prince of Wales Falls.** It is a powerful waterfall within city limits. Also, **Rideau Falls.** The park where this fall is located has monuments, and the falls have two sections, so be sure to walk the extra distance.

Saintlo Ottawa Jail Hostel - Spend the night in jail. Each cell is cordoned off for privacy. Book a two-person stay where the room is bunkbed. There is no bathroom in the room. Parking is extra. This is a unique experience. It has changed ownership. The previous owner would give a history tour of the prison. Check to see if this is included or available.
